District Goals

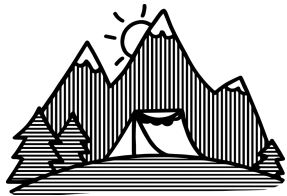
District Goal 1: Literacy will improve across all grade levels with students making academic progress by one or more years.
